During a short visit in March of 2018, I was able to witness a ripple effect that a water well drilling Non-Governmental Organization, Rock Foundation Cambodia, has on local villages and their schools. The Khmer people have faced a systematic political genocide that started with educators and the educated by imprisonment and starvation. In a time of rebuilding and re-establishing an educational system, there is a major roadblock. Schools are open, but the children miss classes because the need to drink water, contaminated water. The ripple effect in this case is the lack of water, that effects continued education and ultimately, effective change in a new generation, culture, and region.
